# **AUTHOR'S NOTE**

I started writing On This Side of the World in 2013 while working on my MFA in Musical Theatre Writing at NYU's Tisch School of the Arts. For one class, we were asked to select a community about which we would write a collection of songs over the next two years. I immediately chose Filipino immigrants in the United States. I was an immigrant myself who moved from Manila to Boston in 2012; I didn't know of any other Filipino immigrant composers and lyricists writing about the Filipino immigrant experience; and I had many Filipino immigrant friends whose stories I could borrow and theatricalize into songs.

In 2018, I began collaborating with director Noam Shapiro. Together, we've discovered, expanded, and tightened the show through numerous artistic residencies and staged readings, a workshop production, a concert staging, and participation in the country's most prestigious festival of new musicals.

And now, we're thrilled that the show is having its world premiere in L.A., the city with the largest Filipino population in the U.S., and at East West Players, the largest and longest-running Asian-American theatre in the country.

Coming into this milestone, Noam and I set out to find a way to elevate the show from an anthology of storysongs into a full theatrical experience that was bigger than the sum of its parts. After several experiments with monologues and dialogue, we landed on something close to my own experience: when I decided to leave a perfectly comfortable life in Manila to study music in Boston in 2012, I started to collect stories from immigrant friends who had made the journey before. And as I flew halfway around the planet with a one-way ticket, wondering what was in store, I replayed these stories in my mind.

# **AUTHOR'S NOTE**

On This Side of the World, then, is a story about stories we hear, hold on to, and pass on, when little is known or certain. Stories that give us glimpses of what's possible, bring us together, and push us forward. Stories that allow us to write our own stories ourselves.

Whether you are Filipino-American, an immigrant of any other background, or just someone who finds yourself suspended in mid-air — I hope you enjoy *On This Side of the World*.
